Q: why is it important and what is one?

As: my sponsor has not been in area service, so when I got into area service I wanted someone who was on fire for service and has experience with the concepts and understands the structure of AA, and can help me through

Different from a regular sponsor, but they might tell you to call your regular sponsor

Highly suggested to go to PRASAA, if you go connect with someone who has been there before so you have a buddy

Q: a GSR who had had a different experience in a different state A: a group conscience is the same as a business meeting in Hawai'i

Q: how does a GSR carry forward a group conscience decision to the next general service conference?

A: The normal process is to 1) bring to district, have district discuss, then it goes back to the groups in the district, then the DCM submits it to the chair of the area – it then goes to the committee meeting (discuss if it is a motion that can be voted on – is it grammatically correct, understandable) – next it comes to the whole assembly for a discussion, gets voted on, if passed by the area assembly, the delegate takes it to the conference

A: As an AA member you are also welcome to type up a proposal and send it to NY

There's no difference if it gets to be an agenda meeting or not – the board meets and decides what agenda items to be discussed, and all items are considered equally – when it becomes time for the committee to look at it, your delegates that sit on that committee may ask if the area is behind it. (If it's a really valid idea it won't make a difference). We as a group are probably wiser than an individual.

Comment: 90% of the work done by 10% of the people

The groups TRUST the trusted servants to make good decisions for them when they don't care

They assume we're going to do the best job we can with the information, when they send us back to our groups

(Right of decision means we are acting for what we think is best for AA) Remember that we are making decisions for AA as a whole

Q: What is a GSR? A conduit of information from the groups to the conference ALSO I'm entrusted as a member of AA to look out for the welfare of AA as a whole Sometimes it looks like carrying the group conscience even when it's not they way you voted on something

Right of decision means that you could actually vote differently than how your group thought, but you must report what you did and why Vote your conscience / what's best for AA

Q: What are we supposed to report at the District meeting?

A: How's your group doing? What are you involved in? Any events? Do we want to collaborate on an event? Ask for caravans to support meetings with low attendance? Are we taking a meeting into a treatment center, does anyone want to go with us? Also a place to ask questions / bring up problems

Q: One member is a GSR for 21 meetings that are all at the same location (Alano Club), had a question about possible confusion between the home group and the Alano Club

A: Another group wrote a short, clear statement in the format of the meeting to make sure people know it's separate

A: Another member said to make sure that if there is any blurring of the lines to nip it in the bud right away

A: Be clear about who has a voice and who has a vote at your business meetings

 The purpose of C.P.C. is our 12th Step – Carrying the Message.

Members of C.P.C. committees inform professionals and future professionals about A.A. – what we are, where we are, what we can do, and what we cannot do!

A professional can be a family doctor or other health care professional, a member of the clergy, a law enforcement or court official, an educator, a social worker, an alcoholism or other counselor, or anyone who deals with problem drinkers in the course of their work. Many of these people often encounter the suffering alcoholic and many of them simple do not know what to do with a drunk!

A look at our history shows clearly that cooperation with professionals has been an integral part of the fellowship since our beginnings.

C.P.C. work can begin when individual A.A.'s reveal their membership to their doctors or drop a quiet word in the ear of a pastor, priest or rabbi that an A.A. member is available to the congregation. Groups can participate in C.P.C. by welcoming professionals to open meetings. Committees actively seek ways to make contact with professional people and set up programs to increase knowledge and understanding of Alcoholics Anonymous.

It is important to remember that cooperation with professionals – like everything else in A.A. is based on personal contact.

CPC work and why AA's do it.

Cooperating with nonalcoholic professionals in an effective way to carry the message to the sick alcoholic. Such people aften meet the alcoholic in the places where AA is not present. Through professionals, alcoholics may be reached who might otherwise never find the program, or they may be reached sooner with the help of informed non-AA's.

Here is a list of jobs and professions that CPC committees have approached. Your committee may think of others: alcoholism or substance abuse counselors: armed forces officers, unit commanders or military chaplains; athletic coaches; corrections officers; court officials; educators; employers and employee assistance professionals; health care professionals (doctor, nurse, psychiatrist, psychologist, etc.); clergypersons; judges; juvenile services professionals; law enforcement officers; lawyers (prosecutor, defense attorney); probation or parole professionals; professional students; public health officials; senior services professionals; social workers; union officials.
