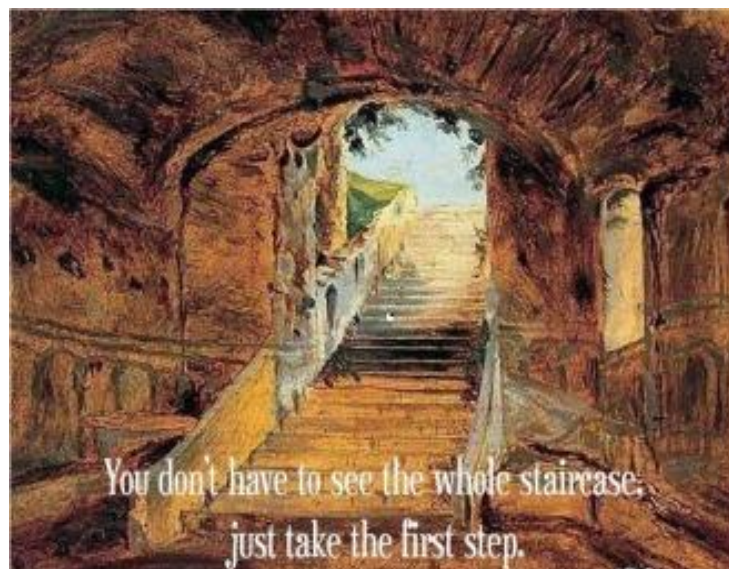

An Upside-Down Organization

Alcoholics Anonymous has been called an upside-down organization because, as the structure chart shows, the groups are on top and the trustees at the bottom. Bill W. wrote in Concept I: “The A.A. groups today hold

ultimate responsibility and final authority for our world services...” Then in Concept II, Bill made it clear that the groups “delegated to the Conference complete authority for the active maintenance of our world services and thereby made the Conference... the actual voice and effective conscience for our whole society.”

Aloha my name is Deborah S. I'm honored to be serving Area 17 Hawai'i as Panel 69 Alternate Chair.

One of my responsibilities is to work with District Committee Member Chairs (DCM) in arranging meeting places and hospitality for all Area assemblies and committee meetings.

Area 17 Hawai'i kicked off Panel 69 with our Orientation Assembly held at the Susanna Wesley Center, January 12-13. Required to attend were Group Service Representatives (GSRs), District Committee Members (DCMS), Standing Committee Chairs, Area Officers, others as necessary. Although challenged with a venue change, lack of early registrations and homestay availability. The assembly was well attended, productive and informative.

What counted most is that Area business was conducted and carried out despite our challenges.

Thank you District 3 for hosting our Orientation assembly. Thank you to the group assembled and meeting groups who provided our meals. Thank you District 3 members who made themselves available to keep the facility clean. Thank you District 3 members and the Oahu fellowship who hosted homestays and provided transportation. Last but never the least, thank you Wolf for your leadership in District 3. I want to close with this. My suggestion to designated districts hosting panel 69 assemblies and committee meetings is start your planning early. Time is on your side.

I implore all those involved in general service to register for assemblies early. Registration forms are available at the assembly preceding the next assembly. Early registration, especially from neighbor island members, is essential for acquiring homestay and transportation commitments from our A.A. community.

Each group is self-supporting. Our group pays our registration so we can hold business at a facility and provide meals during assembly session and airfare (for those traveling inter island). To minimize costs for us to attend assemblies we need to depend on each other, the fellowship, for homestay and transportation. When the fellowship is unable to provide it's usually due to poor planning. Hence, need for hotel stay becomes necessary at the groups expense. Last minute registration ought to be minimal. With that said, before the said deadline date, send in your registration intentions to the assembly registration chair at registration@area17aa.org straight-away, secure an appointment for homestay and transportation and send in your monies as soon as possible. That's your part. The hosting district will then do their part in securing a homestay and transportation.

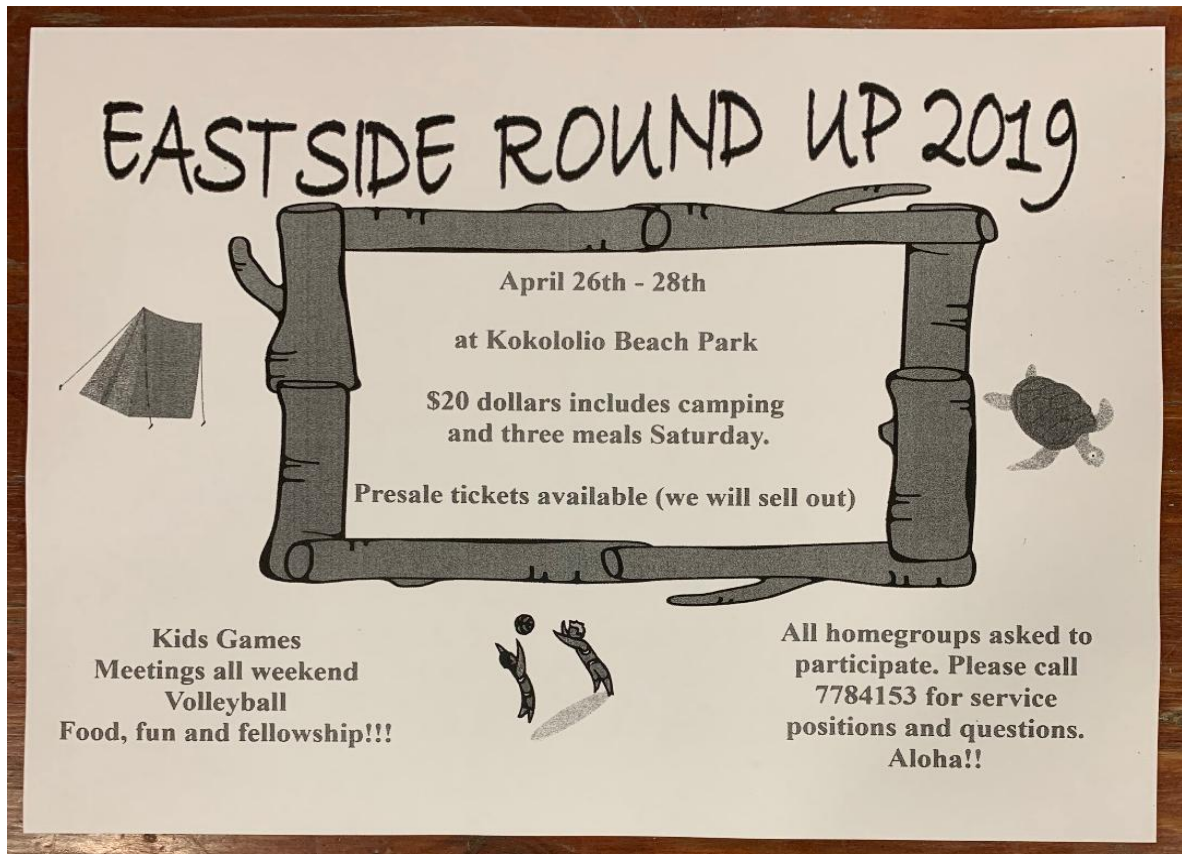

Our primary purpose in the A.A. Preamble is “to stay sober and help other alcoholics to achieve sobriety.” For me, I know that if I do not pick up that first drink and I get to a meeting I can stay sober, but how do I help others to achieve sobriety? Through the years, I’ve learned that being in service is a way to help others. Secretary a meeting, be the literature rep, make coffee, take action.

One place to help others is the Maui A.A. Intergroup Central Office. It’s a great place to be of service, if you’re so inclined! To give you an idea of what an Intergroup is; according to the A.A. Guidelines from the General Service Office in N.Y. – “Intergroup is an A.A. service office that involves a partnership among groups in a community.”

Our Intergroup here on Maui does this by hosting a monthly meeting where representatives from local A.A. groups exchange ideas, information, plan events, and seek common solutions on how best to carry the message. The Maui A.A. Intergroup Central Office helps to carry the message via a 24-hour phone line, along with a website offering a plethora of information. Maui Intergroup also has an actual brick and mortar office in Wailuku – where anyone can stop by to get information, pick up meeting schedules, purchase literature, or just talk story in a safe environment.

Overall, Intergroup offers a centralized office to aid the groups in our common purpose of carrying the message. It also aids the general public by offering information about A.A., by keeping in contact with local A.A. Committees; Public Information, Cooperation with the Professional Community, etc. (See, there’s choke ways to be of service anywhere!)

I’m so grateful to A.A. members in service, and particularly those at every Intergroup around the world. They collectively carried the message to me personally. I was able to find my way to those first A.A. meetings via the Boston Area Intergroup; whose Central Office published a meeting schedule booklet and mailed it to me in non-descript wrapping. When I moved to Maui, I was able to find Maui A.A. meetings and literature through the Maui A.A. Intergroup Central Office. When I travelled to Eastern Europe, I was able to find an English speaking A.A. meeting and meet English speaking members through the Vienna A.A. Intergroup.

My Experience with East Hawaii Intergroup

I became an Intergroup representative back in January 2017. I had my misgivings about the commitment because of my aversion to anything "political." My home group had no representative for a while and I felt it was about time we (I) got more involved with Alcoholics Anonymous on a different level. Much to my surprise, the meeting was ...delightful! In any given month, there are from 10-12 meeting representatives in attendance ready, willing and able to keep Alcoholic Anonymous available to the still suffering (in and out of the rooms) alcoholic. Our Chairman starts the meetings on time, uses Roberts Rules of Order to keep mayhem at bay and ends on time. We discuss, among other things, how each representative's meeting is coming along, the website and meeting directory, literature needs/sales and hot line. We also plan for fun things like dances, Founder's Day, East meets West and Ålcathon's. The members in attendance take their commitment seriously and contribute as needed and are asked to bring back various discussion items to their meetings for a group conscience.

It is soooooo easy to become an Intergroup Representative. Just go to your home group and ask for a group conscience to vote you in as the Intergroup Representative (IGR)! If you already have one, you can become the "alternate" IGR. This would mean you would attend the meeting if the regular IGR cannot make the meeting. In any event, the attending IGR's duty would be to report back to their home group meeting what happened and what was discussed at that month's IG meeting. If a group conscience vote on a particular item is needed, then that would have to be voted on and the IGR would bring it back to the next IG meeting.

See, piece of cake!! If you think you might be interested in this two-year commitment and don't know if you really want to.. .just show up at one of our meetings and see how it feels. We meet on the second Thursday of every month from 5:30 pm to 6:30 pm at the Keaau Community Center (behind the police station). On the other hand, if you feel this is not for you, Intergroup is self-supporting through their own contributions and rely on individual group donations to continue to carry the message. 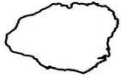
