Why Do We Need a Conference?

The late Bernard B. Smith, nonalcoholic, then chairperson of the board of trustees, and one of the architects of the Conference structure, answered that question superbly in his opening talk at the 1954 meeting: “We may not need a General Service Conference to ensure our own recovery. We do need it to ensure the recovery of the alcoholic who still stumbles in the darkness one short block from this room. We need it to ensure the recovery of a child being born tonight, destined for alcoholism. We need it to provide, in keeping with our Twelfth Step, a permanent haven for all alcoholics who, in the ages ahead, can find in A.A. that rebirth that brought us back to life.

“We need it because we, more than all others, are conscious of the devastating effect of the human urge for power and prestige which we must ensure can never invade A.A. We need it to ensure A.A. against government, while insulating it against anarchy; we need it to protect A.A. against disintegration while preventing overintegration. We need it so that Alcoholics Anonymous, and Alcoholics Anonymous alone, is the ultimate repository of its Twelve Steps, its Twelve Traditions, and all of its services.

“We need it to ensure that changes within A.A. come only as a response to the needs and the wants of all A.A., and not of any few. We need it to ensure that the doors of the halls of A.A. never have locks on them, so that all people for all time who have an alcoholic problem may enter these halls unasked and feel welcome. We need it to ensure that Alcoholics Anonymous never asks of anyone who needs us what his or her race is, what his or her creed is, what his or her social position is.”

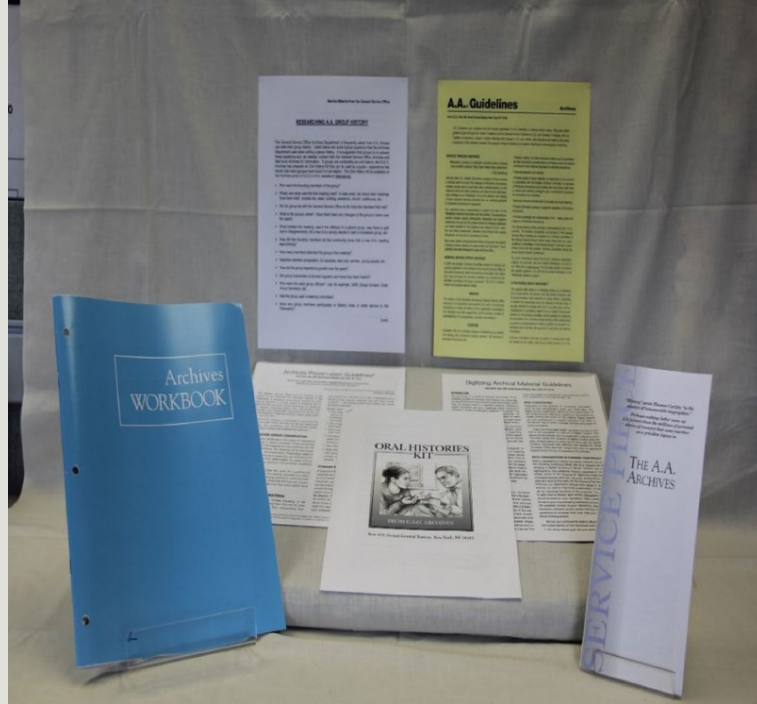
G.S.O. Archives Mission

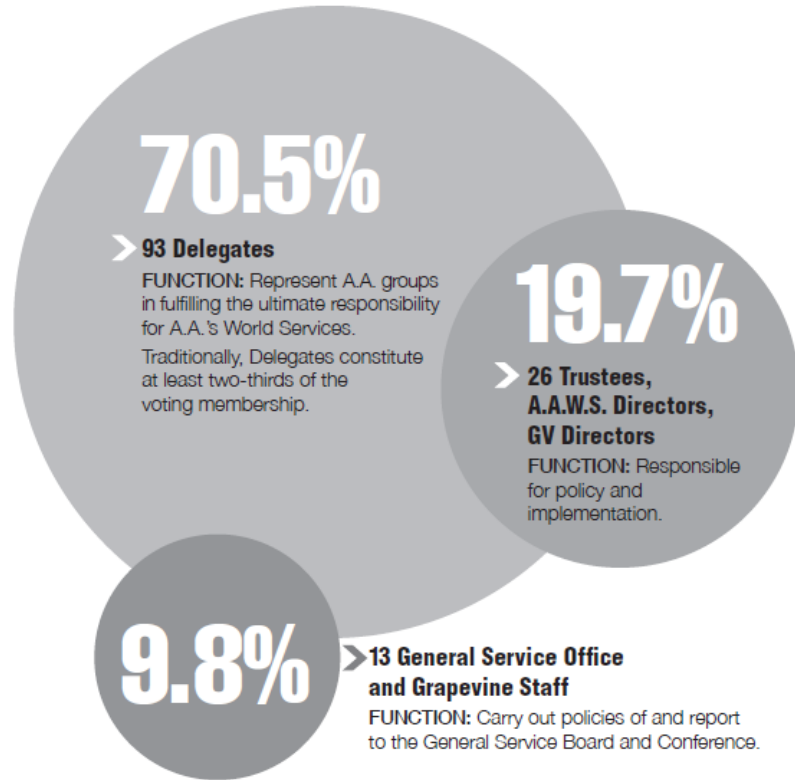

Every Conference member has not only a vote but a voice; not only a right but a responsibility to express his or her views.

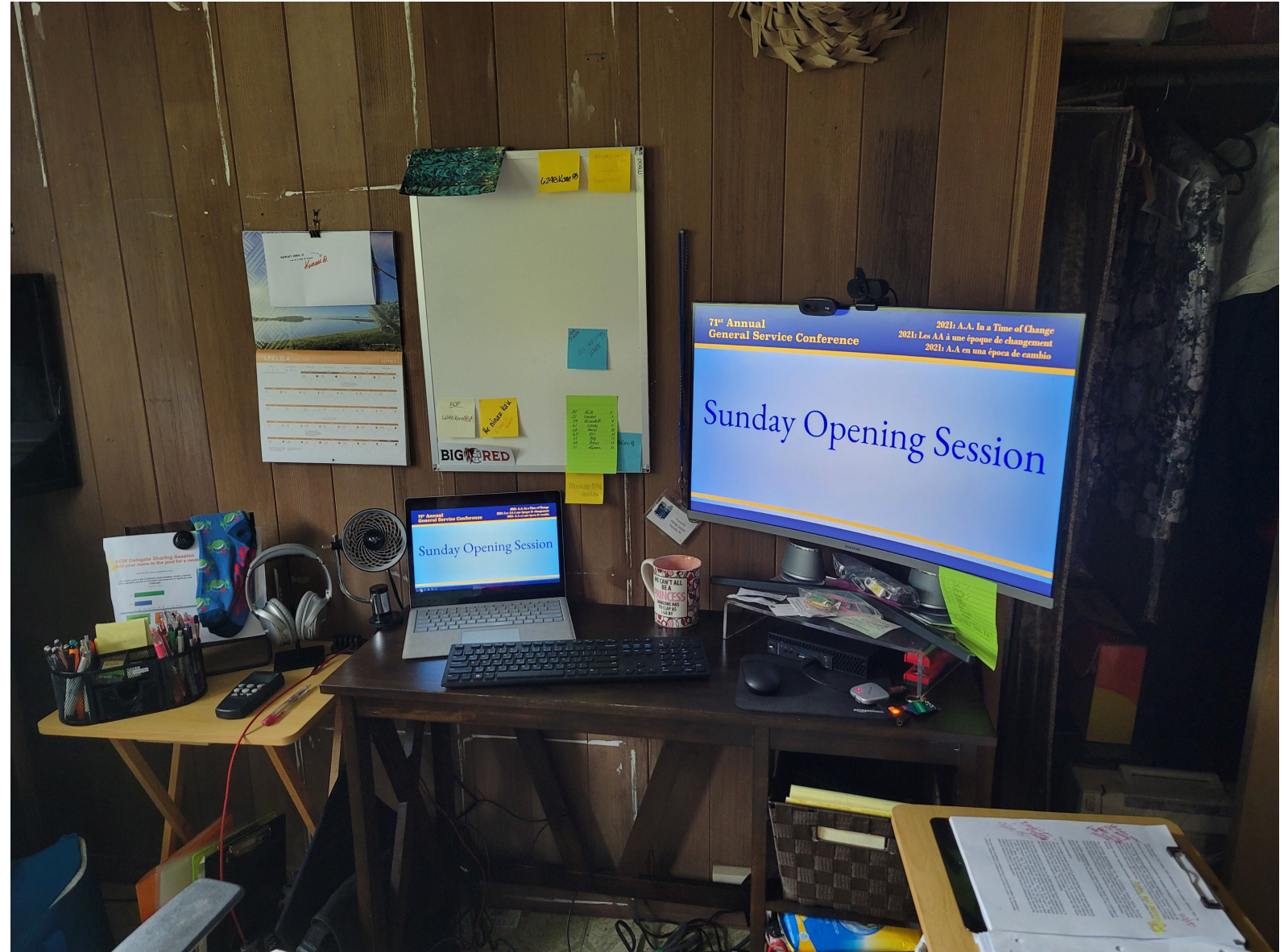

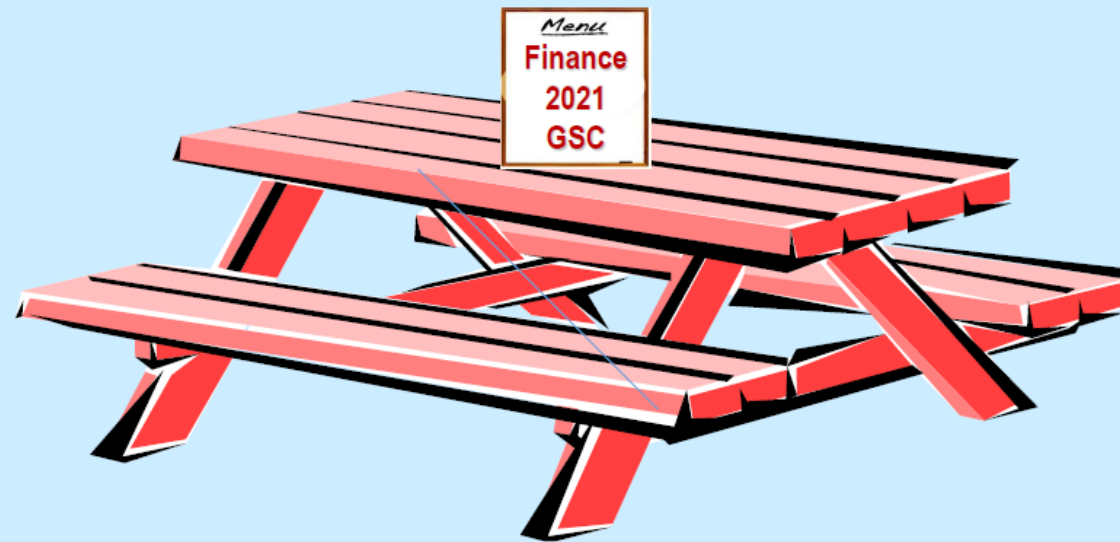

2020 GSO FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

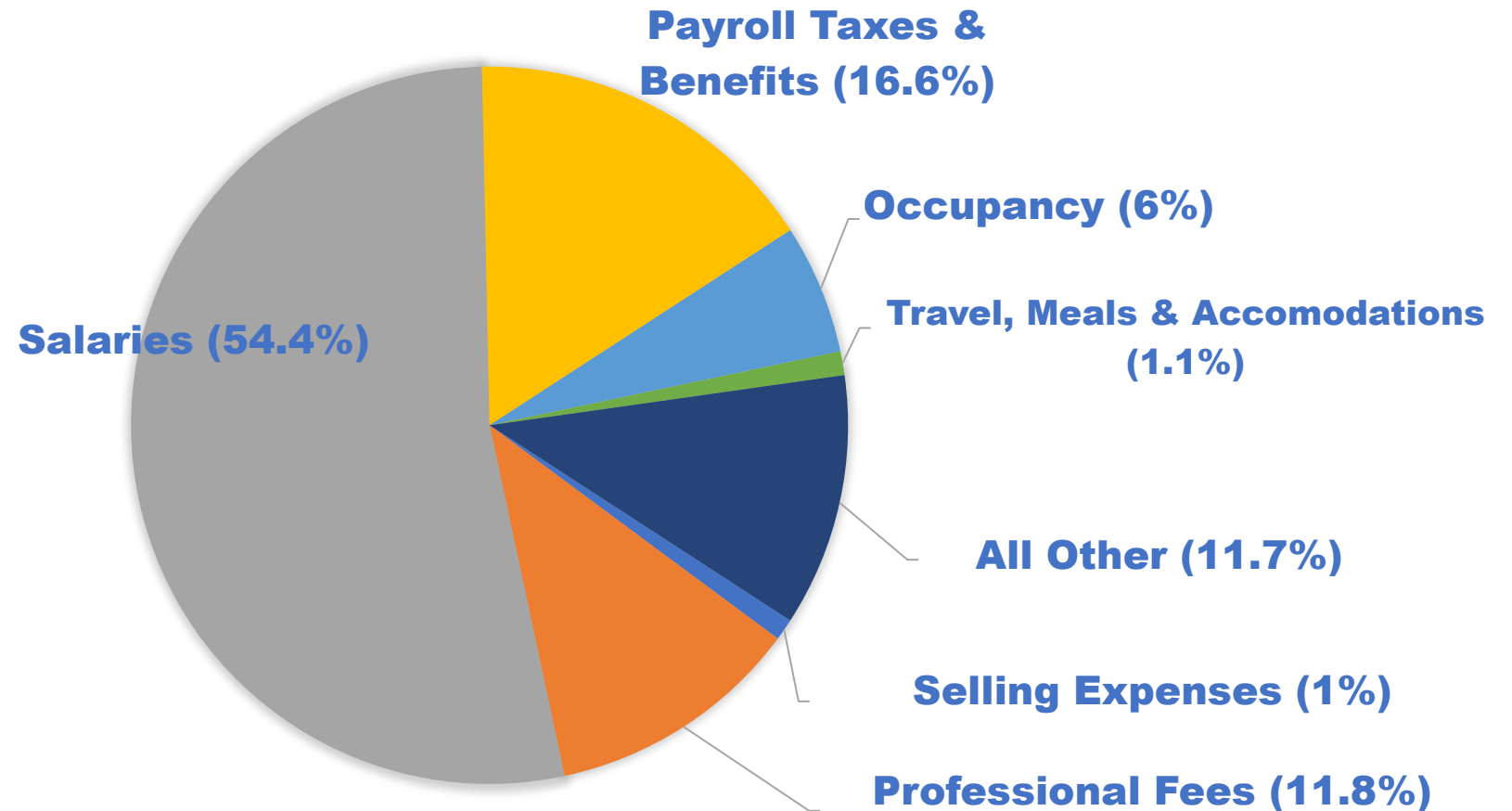
- ❖ 7th Tradition of Self-Support – \$10.26 million set another record, up 15.80% from \$8.86 million in 2019
- ❖ Cost of Services - \$10.81 million down 14.9% from \$12.70 million in 2019
- ❖ Self-Support - covered 94.9% of cost of services compared to 69.8% in 2019
- ❖ AAWS publishing gross profits – \$6.58 million down 29.70% from \$9.36 million in 2019, used to cover \$550K shortfall between 7th Tradition Contributions and Cost of Services

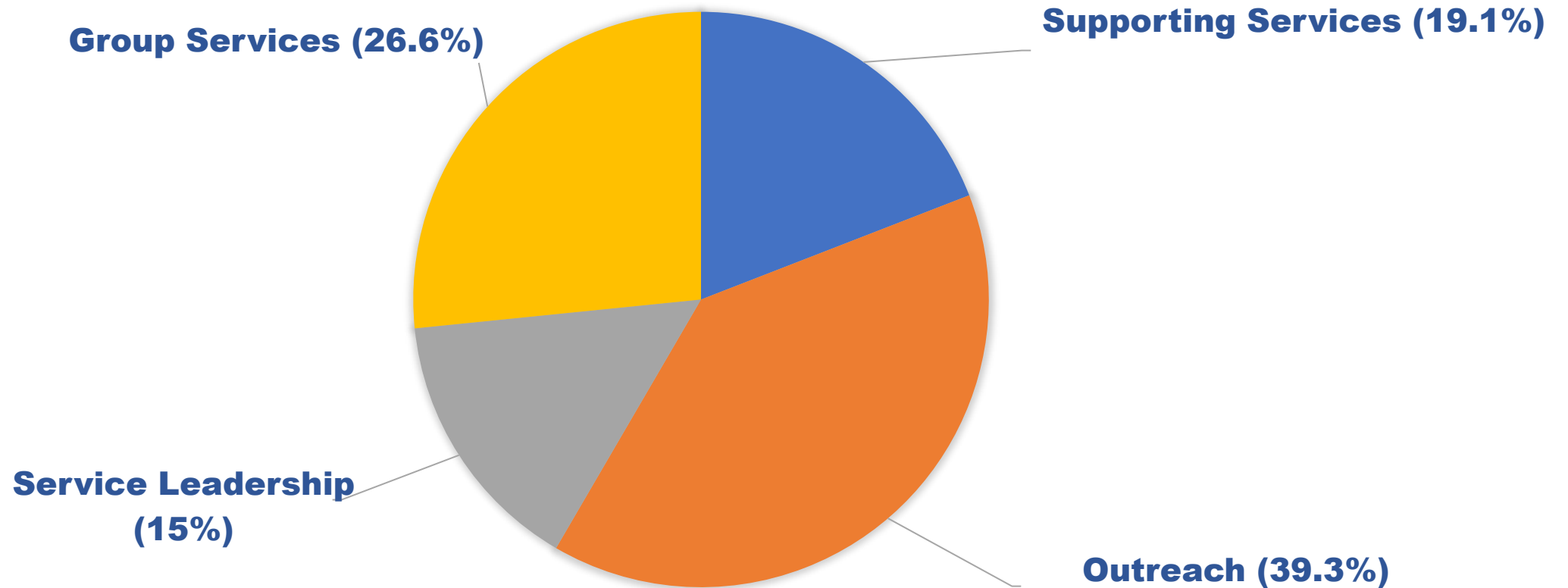

RECURRING OPERATING EXPENSES – 2020 – \$16.6 M

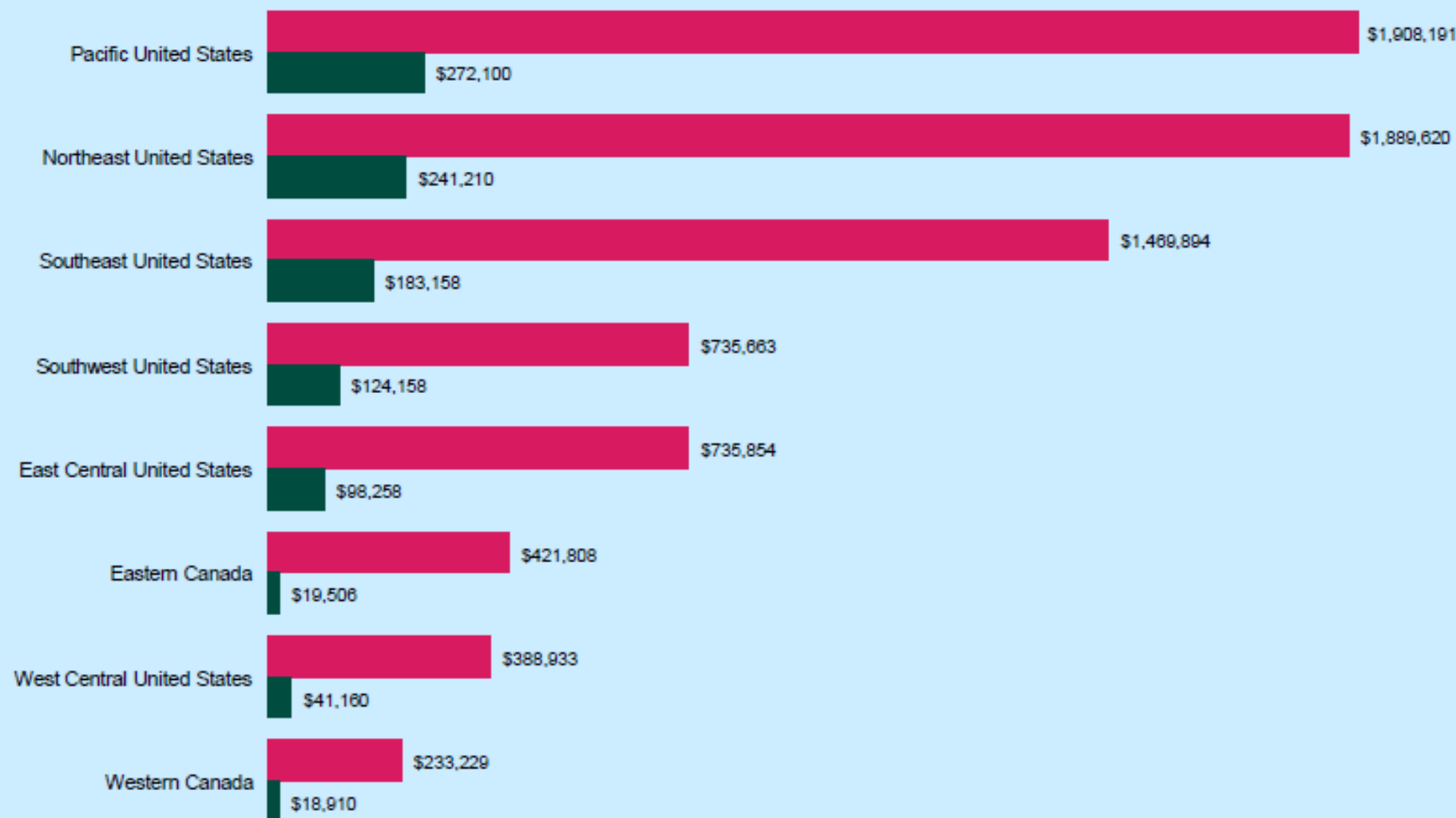


COST OF SERVICES PROVIDED TO THE FELLOWSHIP 2020– \$10.8 M

Contributions Per Capita

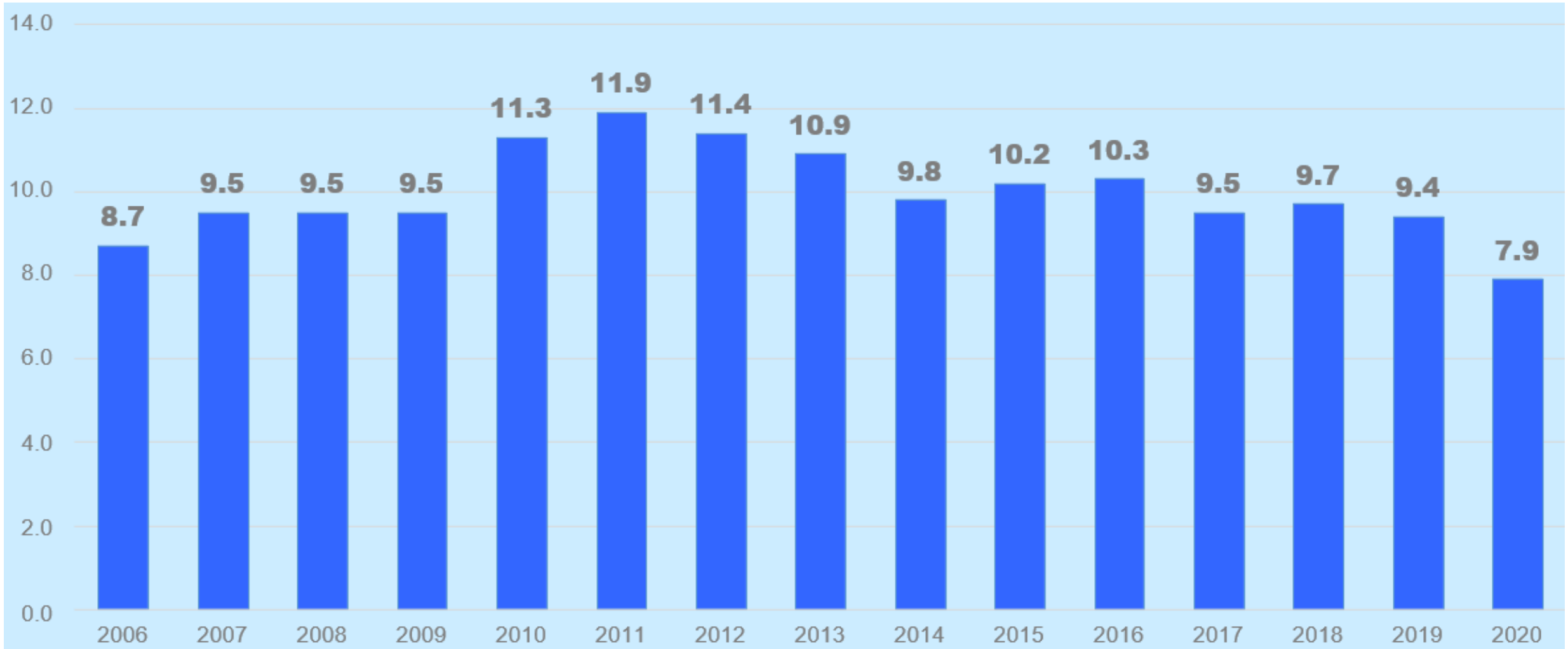

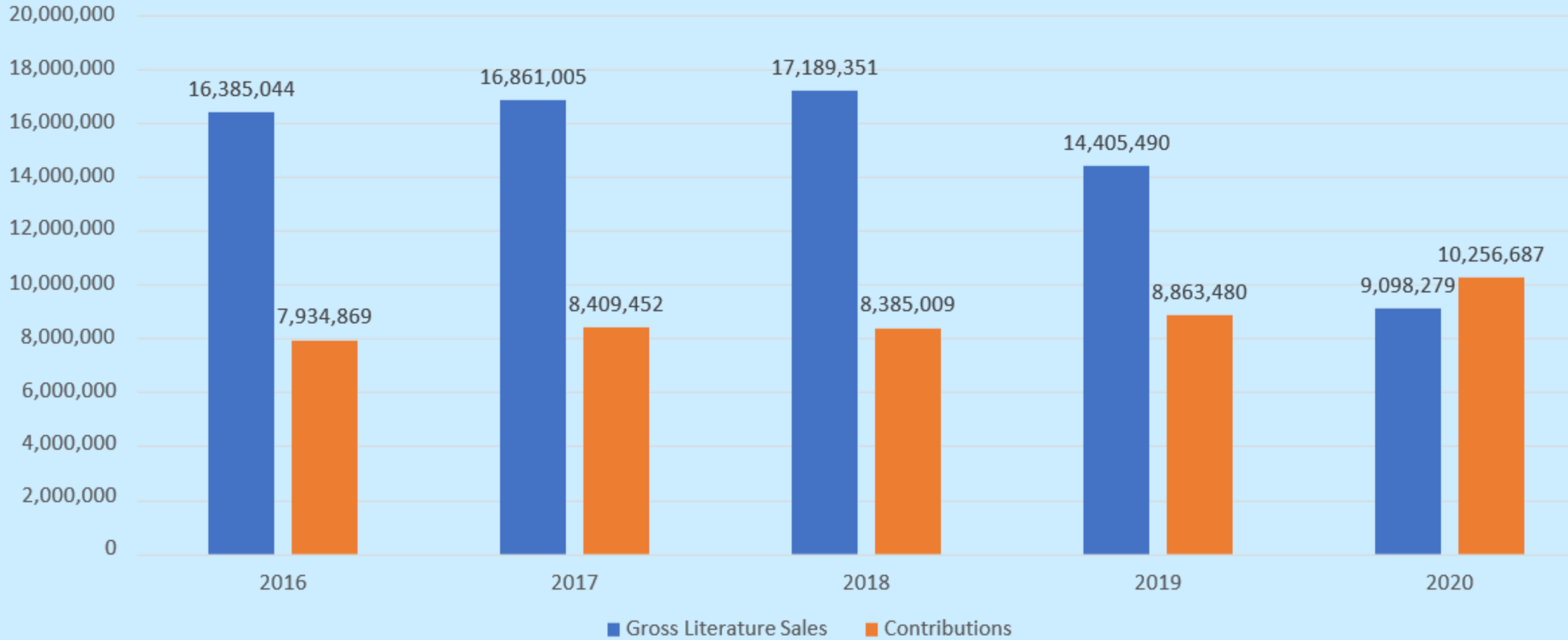

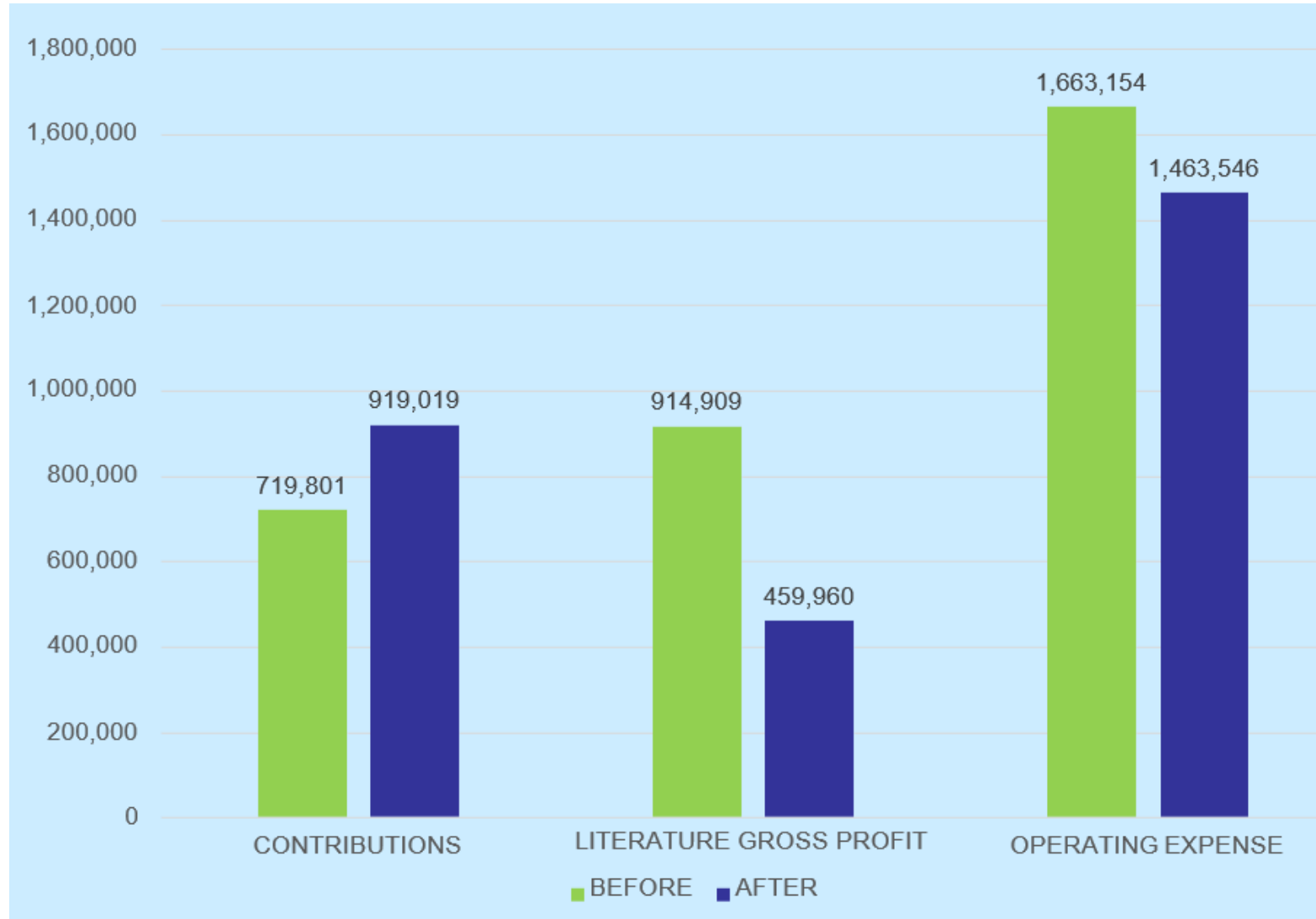


IMPACT OF PANDEMIC ON REVENUE DISTRIBUTION

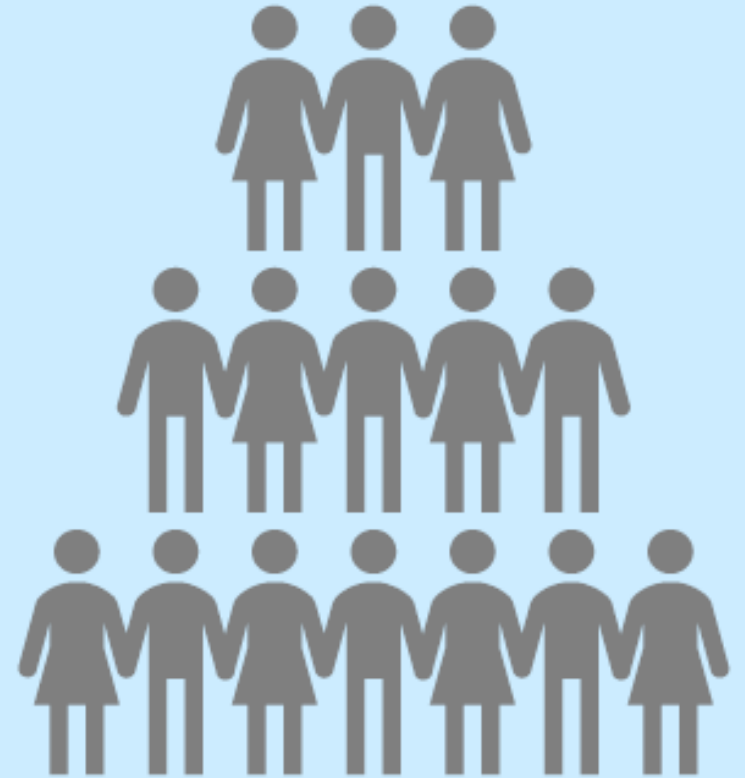

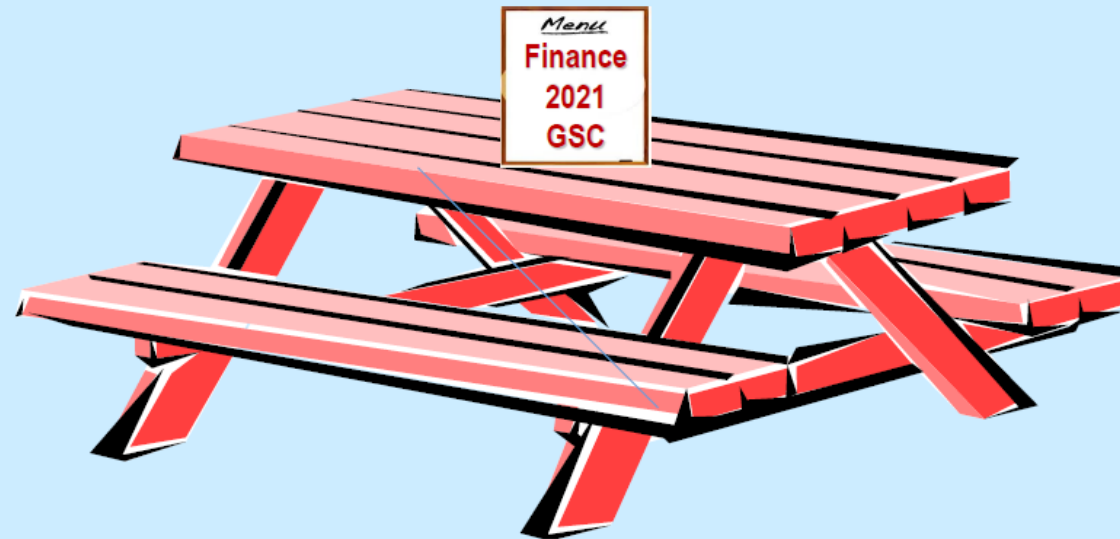


2020 GRAPEVINE FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

- ❖ Grapevine paid print subscriptions decreased 4.5% in 2020. Subscriptions for the online and mobile app magazine increased 7.7%
- ❖ 2020 Grapevine results were a gross profit of \$1.231 M on the magazine and a gross profit of \$354,304 on other published items. Operating expenses of \$1.914 M resulted in an overall loss of \$298,699 compared to a loss of \$27,303 in 2019.
- ❖ General Fund support of La Viña service activity was \$385,771 in 2020 compared to \$297,392 in 2019.
- ❖ La Viña magazine circulation decreased by 36.6% in 2020 after several years of growth.

REPORT & CHARTER

The committee recommended that the revised manuscript distributed to all Conference members in April 2021 with the inclusion of the Original Conference Charter be approved as the 2021-2023 Edition of *The A.A. Service Manual combined with Twelve Concepts for World Service*

PASSED

CORRECTIONS – “Person in Custody”

The committee recommended revisions to A.A.W.S. literature directed to members behind the walls and to replace the terms “inmate” and “offender” with “person in custody.”

*Passed (99/31)
ITD - No Action*

Public Information - Podcasts

The committee recommended that podcasts providing sharing within the Fellowship and information about A.A. to the public be produced and distributed by G.S.O. in cooperation with the Grapevine Office.

*Passed (127/3)
ITD – 89% support*

CPC – Pamphlet directed to mental health professionals

The Committee recommended that the trustees’ Committee on Cooperation with the Professional Community/Treatment and Accessibilities develop a pamphlet directed to mental health professionals.

*Passed (112/19)
ITD – No action*

RECOMMENDATIONS

Policy/Admissions – Equitable Distribution

The committee recommended that the *Equitable Distribution of Workload Process*, as detailed in the Report from the 2020 trustees' General Service Conference Committee, be implemented for the 72nd General Service Conference on a three-year trial basis, with a progress report to be brought to the Conference Committee on Policy and Admissions after each year of the trial.

❖ *Agenda items to be submitted by September 15th*

Policy/Admissions – Online Groups

The committee recommended that the U.S./Canada General Service Structure recognize online groups and encourage their participation, listing those groups who ask to *be listed within the group's preferred district and area*, with the default option being the location of the group's primary contact. This supersedes the 1997 Advisory Action that designated online groups as "International Correspondence Meetings."

Passed (107/22)

The committee recommended that the General Service Board form a *committee to explore future possibilities for the participation of online groups* in the U.S./Canada General Service structure.

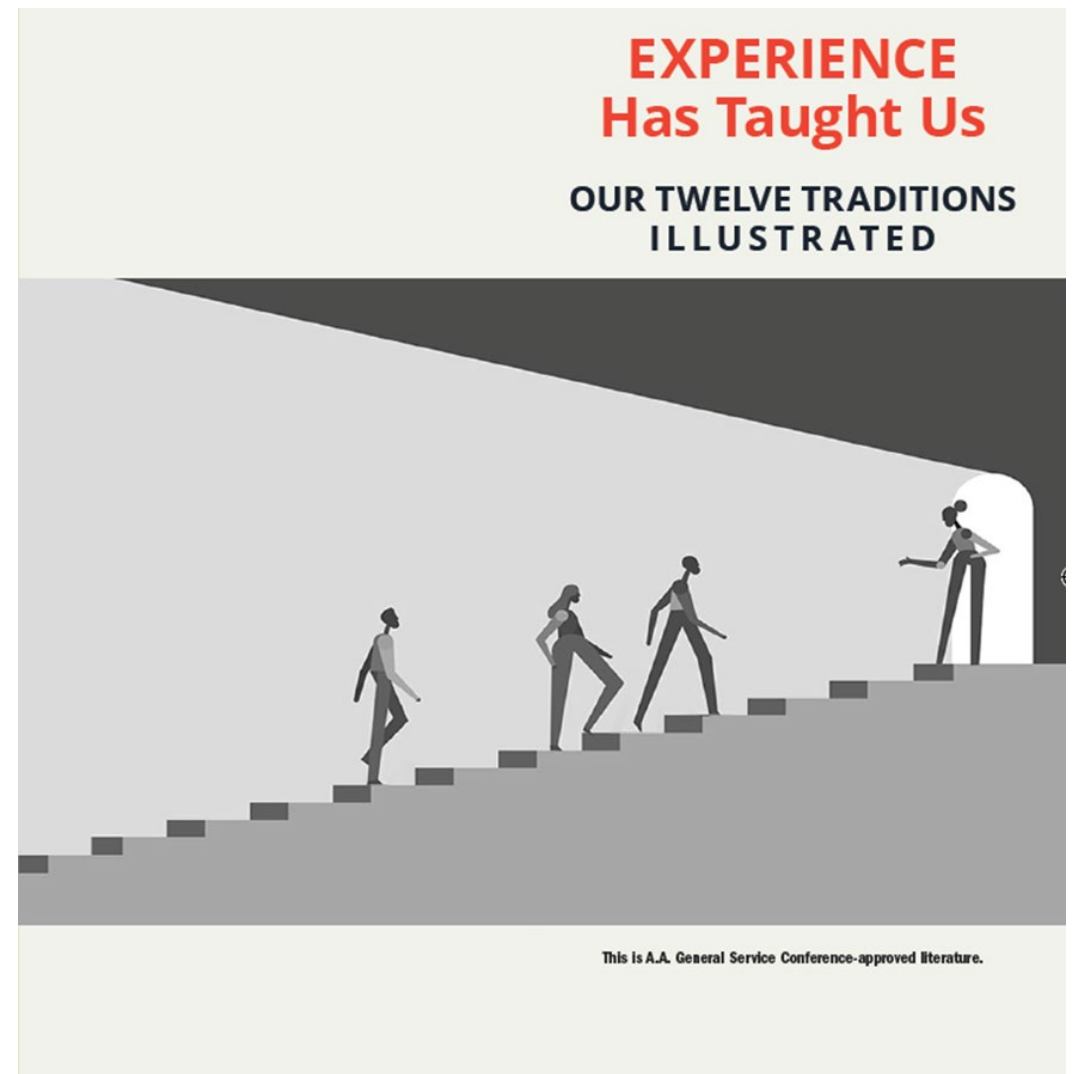

Frequently Asked Question about AA. – CAKES

The committee recommended that the pamphlet, “Frequently Asked Questions About A.A.” be revised on by omitting the text on page 17 “...including coffee, sandwiches, cakes or whatever else may be served,” as follows:

The line on page 17 currently reads:

“...to defray the cost of renting a meeting place and other meeting expenses, including coffee, sandwiches, cakes or whatever else may be served.”

Be revised to read:

“...to defray the cost of renting a meeting place and other meeting expenses.”

RECOMMENDATIONS

12x12 – Remove the phrase “opposite sex”

The committee recommended a revision to page 117 in the book, *Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions*, replacing the phrase “opposite sex” with the word “partner” as follows, and that a footnote be added to provide context to the change as it relates to inclusivity:

"Nearly every sound human being experiences, at some time in life, a compelling desire to find a partner with whom the fullest possible union can be made – spiritual, mental, emotional, and physical. This mighty urge is the root of great human accomplishments, a creative energy that deeply influences our lives. God fashioned us that way "

ITD – 80% supported

12x12 – Remove the phrase “Lustful enough to rape”

The committee recommended that the sentence which includes the phrase “lustful enough to rape” in paragraph one on page 66 in the chapter “Step Six” of the book, *Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions*, be revised to refer to the Seven Deadly Sins without specific mention of examples that are severe in nature as follows, and that a footnote be added to provide context as to the basis for the change:

"No one wants to commit the deadly sins of anger, lust, or gluttony."

Big Book – 164 Pages

The committee agreed that the first 164 pages of Alcoholics Anonymous should remain unchanged.

Big Book – Develop 5th Edition

The committee recommended that a Fifth Edition of the Big Book, Alcoholics Anonymous, be developed, including an update of stories to better reflect current membership, keeping in mind the 1995 Advisory Action that: “The first 164 pages of the Big Book, Alcoholics Anonymous, the Preface, the Forewords, ‘The Doctor’s Opinion,’ ‘Dr. Bob’s Nightmare,’ and the Appendices remain as is,” and that a progress report be brought back to the 2022 Conference Committee on Literature.

Big Book – 5th Edition

The committee recommended that, pending its development, the draft Fifth Edition of the Big Book would include a new foreword, an updated preface and updates to expand on existing ideas in Appendices III and V.

Literature: The committee recommended that a draft version of the book, *Alcoholics Anonymous (Fourth Edition)*, be translated into **plain and simple language** and be developed in a way that is accessible and relatable to as wide of an audience as possible.

The Original "Ad Hoc Committee Progress Report - Google Grants and the 7th Tradition," from the trustees' Finance Committee, dated March 30, 2020, be immediately released to all members of the 71st General Service Conference. We feel strongly that this information is indispensable for the purposes of looking at the Google Grants through the lens of our AA Principles. **VOTED DOWN**

It was recommended that edits to the chapters "To Wives," "The Family Afterward" and "To Employers" (pgs 104-149) in the book *Alcoholics Anonymous* will be allowed, but the Preface, the Forewords, "The Doctor's Opinion" (pgs xi-xxxii), "Dr. Bob's Nightmare" and the Appendices remain as is. **Maker of the motion RESCINDED their motion citing satisfaction with approval to develop a plain language translation of the BB.**

That the pamphlet "A.A. for the Native North American" be updated to include language that is both respectful and inclusive of all Indigenous peoples as well as add fresh stories and updating inaccuracies contained in the current pamphlet and that a draft pamphlet be brought back to the 2022 Conference Committee on Literature.
