- 5) Serve as a voting member of the Oahu Intergroup when invited. Deborah L, our area Alt Chair will be attending in my place as I live here on the Big Island. I attend monthly and carry a vote at the West Hawaii District 8 Central Office Business Meeting.

Last month I talked about communication. Communication, communication, communication. Again, this is a reminder that we all have a responsibility, not just our GSRs, who are, as we say, the link in the chain. We are all responsible for reaching out to our members to keep them informed.

I won't take much more of your time, but I did attend (PRAASA), the Pacific Region Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly and it was terrific. I will be giving my PRAASA report later today.
