The flow of CIRCLES OF LOVE AND SERVICE

"We alcoholics see that we must work together and hang together, else most of us will finally die alone" Alcoholics Anonymous, p.561

Where it starts: A.A. is made up of interconnected circles of people within the Fellowship, who work together to carry A.A.'s message of hope. But in order for A.A. to run itself without bosses or rules, in accordance with our Twelve Traditions, we need a system of communication for finding out how A.A. as a whole feels about its world affairs, and how it wants to operate.

For A.A. to run its own affairs, each A.A. group needs to make its voice heard on overall A.A. policies. This starts with a group's general service representative (G.S.R.), who represents the voice of the group conscience and has the job of linking his or her group with A.A. as a whole. G.S.R.s make sure their groups receive services from the U.S. and Canada General Service Office (G.S.O) and help groups stay informed about worldwide A.A.

INFORM THE DELEGATE

Background: Each year, the GSO sends out VOLUMES of information to the area delegates. The intent is to bring it back to our home groups ... and then bring the collective decision/voice of that home group on any particular topic back to the delegate.

The delegate then brings those collective voices, on numerous topics to the annual General Service Conference which is held in NY every spring.

On some topics, the delegate is very sure of how our area feels on a particular topic, on others ... not so much. So our delegate will decide which topics need more input from the collective voices of the area.

Now is the time that area 17 divides the work and we bring the group consciousness back to the "Inform the Delegate Assembly" which is coming up in April. The GSR for 12CWO is assigned to the Archives Committee. What will be distributed to the DCMs, then passed to the GSRs is the information that our home group will be asked to discuss, come to the collective direction that will be passed back to our Delegate/Tommy.

1) **Delegate** decides which topics he / she wants more feedback on



3) GSRs received the information from their DCM ASAP and present it to their home group at thei group conscious meeting. The collective voice of the home group on these topics are then given back to the Deletage at the INFORM THE DELEGATE assembly in April



4) Our Delegate then takes the collective voices on the chosen topics to the General Service Conference in May in NY

DCMs and GSRs Tips and tricks to be successful:

- DCMs get the information distributed to GSRs ASAP and answer any questions.
- Both DMC and GSRs ... Don't wait till the last minute to READ! Read the background material, the pros and the cons
- GSR's Give a concise overview to your home group to keep the Group Conscious Meeting short and focused
- Be prepared to carry the group's collective voice on these topics to the INFORM THE DELEGATE assembly in April
- Ask questions! Everyone wants you to be successful and love your new role of service.
 - ... GSRs ask DCMs ... DCMs ask the Chair ... Chair asks Delegate!

Don't Lose Yourself

As an alcoholic in recovery I am reading this quote probably quite differently than most of you "normies". For me a temporary feeling, or lack thereof, would come from a drink or a drug. But for me, a drink or a drug will never be enough; a thousand drinks or drugs will never be enough. Therefore, that temporary feeling has just grown into a full-force tragedy.

One of my greatest reliefs in admitting than I am an alcoholic came when I learned that alcoholism is a disease...a disease of mind and body. I no longer had to live with the guilt and shame of having no will power or self-control. I'm not stupid, but I couldn't go a day without drinking and thinking obsessively about it. And if I wasn't doing the deed or thinking about it, I was feeling pretty loathsome because of the aftereffects.

After rehab I attended a 12 Step Group as was suggested. Here is where the magic happened for me. I finally found a group of non-judgmental like-minded folks that loved me until I could love myself, who wanted the best for me asking nothing in return, who accepted me for who and what I am. I worked the Steps with them and discovered what makes me tick and why I wanted to lose myself for the sake of temporary feelings. I learned I no longer had to escape from people, places or things (over which I had no control) nor from myself.

If I stay in the middle of the pack of my new-found network, live from my heart and not my head, give away what was so freely given to me, and trust in a power greater than myself, I no longer need to escape, nor lose myself for the sake of temporary feelings...because my feelings are perfect for me right in this moment, to help me grow and become empowered, and to be the best me that I can be.
